**Re: Correction request – "End the sleight of hand of immigration consultants"
(Editorial, May 17, 2026)**

Dear Editor,

[CAPIC-ACCPI](#), the recognized national voice of over 4,000 RCICs, formally requests corrections to your May 17 editorial, "[End the sleight of hand of immigration consultants.](#)"

First, the primary source Eoin Logan is a direct commercial competitor of RCICs. This material conflict was not disclosed to readers.

Second, "Immigration consultant" is a legally protected title under [s. 77](#) of the *College of Immigration and Citizenship Consultants Act*. The editorial conflates RCICs with unauthorized practitioners (UAPs), whose conduct is an offence under IRPA [s. 91](#)(9). It is UAPs, not RCICs, who drive the fraud condemned.

Third, [CICC](#) is the first statutory public-interest regulator of RCICs and RISIAs, not a third failed self-regulator. It has been operational only since 2021.

CAPIC requests corrections and either a UAP-focused follow-up editorial or space for CAPIC's CEO to respond directly.
