Re: Correction request – "Unregistered immigration consultant made nearly \$500K over 3 years and never told the CRA, says agency" (June 26, 2026)

Dear Mr. Caruso-Moro,

The Canadian Association of Professional Immigration Consultants ([CAPIC-ACCPI](#)) is the association recognized by the Government of Canada as the national voice of Regulated Canadian Immigration Consultants (RCICs) and Regulated International Student Immigration Advisors (RISIAs). We represent over 4,000 members across every province and territory.

We are writing to request a correction to the use of the legally protected title "immigration consultant" in your June 25, 2026 news report, "[Unregistered immigration consultant made nearly \\$500K over 3 years and never told the CRA, says agency.](#)"

Our intention is not adversarial. CTV News occupies a position of significant public trust, and CAPIC remains committed to promoting ethical and competent immigration practice in the public interest.

We wish to clarify that "immigration consultant" is a **legally protected title under sections 2 and 77 of the *College of Immigration and Citizenship Consultants Act*, SC 2019, c. 29, s. 292**, and is reserved for College licensees, namely RCICs and RISIAs. Accordingly, we respectfully request that the term "unregistered immigration consultant" in the news report be replaced with "unauthorized practitioner."

Please note that, in the immigration context, UAP conduct constitutes an offence under **subsection 91(9) of the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*, SC 2001, c. 27**. It is therefore essential to maintain a clear distinction between licensed immigration consultants and UAPs, so that regulated professionals are not associated with individuals operating unlawfully.
